in infrastructures of impunity elizabeth f drexler argues that the creation and persistence of impunity for the perpetrators of the cold war indonesian genocide 1965 66 is not only a legal status but also a cultural and social process impunity for the initial killings and for subsequent acts of political violence has many elements bureaucratic military legal political educational and affective although these elements do not always work at once at times some are dormant while others are ascendant together they can be described as a unified entity a dynamic infrastructure whose existence explains the persistence of impunity for instance truth telling a first step in many responses to state violence did not undermine the infrastructure but instead bent to it creative and artistic responses to revelations about the past however have begun to undermine the infrastructure by countering its temporality affect and social stigmatization and demonstrating its contingency and specific actions policies and processes that would begin to dismantle it drexler contends that an infrastructure of impunity could take hold in an established democracy

in indonesia the events of 1st october 1965 were followed by a campaign to annihilate the communist party and its alleged sympathisers it resulted in the murder of an estimate of one million people a genocide that counts as one of the largest mass murders after wwii and the incarceration of another million many of them for a decade or more without any legal process this drive was justified and enabled by a propaganda campaign in which communists were painted as atheist hypersexual amoral and intent to destroy the nation to date the effects of this campaign are still felt and the victims are denied the right of association and freedom of speech this book presents the history of the genocide and propaganda campaign and the process towards the international people s tribunal on 1965 crimes against humanity in indonesia ipt 1965 which was held in november 2015 in the hague the netherlands the authors an indonesian human rights lawyer and a dutch academic examine this unique event which for the first time brings these crimes before an international court and its verdict they single out the campaign of hate propaganda as it provided the incitement to kill so many indonesians and why this propaganda campaign is effective to this day the first book on this topic it fills a significant gap in asian studies and genocide studies

the violence directed against the political left in indonesia from 1965 until 1968 has been the subject of intense speculation the large number of deaths and brutal interrogations as well as rape torture short and long term detention and on going discrimination inflicted on hundreds of thousands of people makes this a compelling topic however political sensitivities within indonesia and a dearth of evidence made serious research on the topic extremely difficult under the new order regime the contours of mass violence in indonesia presents case studies from diverse locations throughout the indonesian archipelago the accounts revolve around the impact and interpretations of the september 30th movement and its aftermath the roles of military and civilian groups in fomenting and perpetrating violence short and long term detention and the legacies of the assault on the political left although events unfolded differently in various parts of the country the violence amounted to a counter revolution intended to curtail the mass mobilization and popular participation unleashed by the national revolution some twenty years earlier the goal was to destroy the social bases of president sukarno s left leaning guided democracy and to establish a military regime that was authoritarian and pro western students of indonesia will learn much from the accounts in this volume but the discussion will also benefit scholars concerned with the dynamics of mass violence the cold war regime change and counter revolution

mayasari hoffert examines the depiction of the left in indonesian literature since the anti leftist purge in 1965 with close textual analysis of indonesian literary texts and their political context this book investigates how the new order regime under suharto was able to build a metanarrative of liberation while purging the left in indonesia even after the regime s end in 1998 many indonesians still have an ingrained fear of the prospect of communism with the result being that literary representation of the left is still seen as problematic through reviewing indonesia s institution of literature the use and abuse of universal humanism under the new order regime is examined and the ways in which power intersects with literature is explored an informative read for scholars and students of indonesian politics literature and the cultural cold war

the interactions and mutual perceptions of china and indonesia were a significant element in asia s postcolonial transformation but as a result of prevailing

emphasis on diplomatic and political relations within a cold war and nation state framework their multi dimensional interrelationship and its complex domestic ramifications have escaped scholarly scrutiny china and the shaping of indonesia provides a meticulous account of versatile interplay between knowledge power ethnicity and diplomacy in the context of sino indonesian interactions between 1949 and 1965 taking a transnational approach that views asia as a flexible geographical and political construct this book addresses three central questions first what images of china were prevalent in indonesia and how were narratives about china construed and reconstructed second why did the china metaphor the projection of an imagined foreign land onto the local intellectual and political milieu become central to indonesians conception of themselves and a cause for self criticism and rediscovery third how was the china metaphor incorporated into indonesia s domestic politics and culture and how did it affect the postcolonial transformation the fate of the ethnic chinese minority and sino indonesian diplomacy employing a wide range of hitherto untapped primary materials in indonesian and chinese as well as his own interviews hong liu presents a compelling argument that many influential politicians and intellectuals among them sukarno hatta and pramoedya utilized china as an alternative model of modernity in conceiving and developing projects of social engineering cultural regeneration and political restructuring that helped shape the trajectory of modern indonesia the multiplicity of china thus constituted a site of political contestations and intellectual imaginations the study is a major contribution both to the intellectual and political history of indonesia and to the reconceptualization of asian studies it also serves as a timely reminder of the importance of historicizing china s rising soft power in a transnational asia

during the 1950s and first half of the 1960s the indonesian communist party grew from a few thousand members to become the third largest communist party in the world before it was annihilated in a violent purge in 1965 6 that saw perhaps half a million alleged communists killed whilst a growing body of scholarship has analysed the anti communist violence of 1965 6 much less has been written about the party s experience and significance in the preceding decade and a half communism cold war and revolution the indonesian communist party in west java 1949 1966 is the first major study of the party during that period to be written since the end of the cold war the book examines the party s development at the intersection of world communism a global cold war and indonesia s revolution it shows that the party represented both a revolutionary organisation and a vibrant movement which was both linked to international networks and deeply intertwined with indonesia s social fabric in this book matthew woolgar introduces the term archipelagic communism to encapsulate the ability of the party to achieve impressive growth amid a growing pluralism in global communism and a context of extreme local cultural and social diversity woolgar takes the case study of west java a populous and diverse province which had a substantial communist presence as an entry point for examining these developments the study draws on a wide array of sources ranging from interviews and government documents to newly available party archives to recreate party life in unprecedented depth the study traces the dialogue that communist leaders engaged in with foreign comrades but also argues that key to the party s growth were activist energies at the grassroots and the party s efforts to navigate social cultural and ethnic cleavages within indonesian society it shows how the party became entangled with trade unionism land conflicts struggles for women s rights youth activism and cultural activities it also delineates how conservative elites backed by western governments used counter revolutionary violence to destroy the communist party and institute a wide ranging reshaping of indonesian society removing labour rights reversing

land reforms enforcing a patriarchal state ideology and reinforcing markers of ethnic and religious difference

despite being a major player in the ending of soeharto's new order regime in 1998 today the Indonesian pro democracy movement is a marginal force in Indonesian politics and the process of reformasi is in the hands of other elite forces accordingly there are some who now question if the quest to establish what would have been the world's third largest democracy is now a lost cause this book represents a unique joint effort by concerned scholars and reflective activists to review and analyze the character problems and options facing the Indonesian pro democracy movement it is the first study to analyze why the pro democracy movement failed to capitalize on its earlier successes and today is marginalized

this volume is the result of a conference held in October 2015 in connection with the Frankfurt book fair discussing developments that are considered important in contemporary Indonesian cultural productions the first part of the book reflects on the traumatic experiences of the Indonesian nation caused by a failed coup on October 1 1965 in more general theoretical terms this topic connects to the field of memory studies which in recent decades has made an academic comeback the focus of the chapters in this section is how certain often distressing events are represented in narratives in a variety of media that are periodically renewed changed rehearsed repeated and performed in order to become or stay part of the collective memory of a certain group of people the second part of the book explores how forces of globalisation have impacted upon the local and linguistically surprisingly rather homogeneous cultural productions of Indonesia the main strands of inquiry in this second section are topics of global trends in religion responses to urban development the impact of popular literary developments and how traditions are revisited in order to come to terms with international cultural developments
